Spending Time with Family and Plant Friends!

Title: Backyard BioBlitz

Age Group: 5th – 8th Grade

Purpose:

- Why? You don't know what's there until you try to find out. This activity challenges kids to
 notice the biodiversity in their own environment, exercising a host of STEM practices while
 making them more aware of their surroundings.
- How? Explore your backyard and closely observe plants.
- What? Fun way to learn to identify plants and recognize the great variety of plants (biodiversity), even in your own yard.

Steps:

- 1. Create a map of your yard
- 2. Choose a small section of your yard to explore closely
- 3. Gather supplies: notebook or paper, pencil, magnifying glass, plastic bags or small jars for samples
- 4. Get outside and start counting different plants
- 5. Draw pictures, take photos, or collect samples
- 6. As a family, review what you found and use a field guide or online resource to determine what species you've discovered
- 7. Discuss! What surprised you? Did you think you would find more or fewer different species? Would you have found the same kinds of plants in a different part of the yard? Why or why not? On another day choose a different part of the yard and check it out!
